## READ

## PREP

Pre-wash fabrics if desired. Press and spray starch as desired.

## MATERIALS

- 1-¼ yard of 43-44"-wide flannel or quilting cotton
- Minimum of 175 yard skein of yarn #2-#4 weight
- Perle Cotton to match yarn color and embroidery needle
- Crochet hooks
- Small scissors
- Ruler, marking tool, rotary cutter, rotary mat, iron

## PROJECT SIZE

1-¼ yard of fabric will yield one 40-42" square receiving blanket or four 20" square napkins. If you desire a larger project--start with more material and make it whatever size you want. **Tip: If you're a beginner, I suggest starting with a napkin-size to start.**

## ABBREVIATIONS OF STITCHES USED IN U.S. TERMS

Chain (ch)

Slip Stitch (sl st)

Single Crochet (sc)

Double Crochet (dc)

Half Double Crochet (hdc)

Space(s) (sp) or (sps)

Stitch(es) (st) or (sts)

## NOTES

Normally in crochet the chain stitch(es) at the beginning of a row (or round in our case) does not count as a stitch but I have counted them in some of my edge patterns.

The written instructions on page 3 are mostly written in crochet shorthand abbreviations. An asterisk \* will show where the pattern repeats. \*Starts the pattern repeat and an \* at end means to start from the beginning \*.

Since project sizes can vary, we don't count total number of stitches but work in groups of 3 stitches on each loop of the first row (or round) to create a base for the four edge designs to fit nicely onto--regardless of the project's size.



## SQUARE

### Round 1

Chain (ch) 1 to start

Single Crochet (sc) 2 in first loop

\*sc 3 in each loop to corner, ch 1\* repeat until back to ch at start, sl st to join

### Round 2

ch 3 to start, Double Crochet (dc) 2 all in first loop

\* Skip 3 spaces (sps)

In 4th space (sp) dc 3 into same sp\* repeat to corner

\*At corner, dc 3, ch 1 dc 3 all in corner sp\* repeat from first \* to corner\*

dc 3, ch 1, slip stitch (sl st) twice to end

## CLAMSHELL

### Round 1

Ch 3 to start, sc 2 all in first loop

\*sc 3 in each loop to corner, ch 1\* repeat until back to ch at start, sl st to join

### Round 2

ch 3 to start, dc 4 all in first loop

\*skip 2 sts, sc 1 in following (3rd) stitch

skip 2 sts, dc 5 in following (3rd) stitch\* until corner

At corner, dc 5, ch 1, dc 5 all in corner stitch\* repeat from first \*

Sl st twice to end

## PICOT

### Round 1

Ch 2, sc 2 all in first loop

\*sc 3 in each loop to corner, ch 1\* repeat until back to ch at start, sl st to join

### Round 2

\*ch 5

sl st in base of chain

ch 5

sl st in base of chain

ch 5

sl st in base of chain

ch 5, skip 5 sts, sl st in following (6th) st\* repeat to end

sl st twice to end

## POM-POM

### Round 1

Ch 1, half double crochet (hdc) 3 all in first loop

\*hdc 3 in each loop to corner, ch 1\* repeat until back to ch at start, sl st to join

### Round 2

\*ch 1

hdc 5 into base of starting ch 1 (yarn over into base, yarn over, yarn over and pull through only 2 loops each hdc, repeat 4 more times to have 6 loops on hook. Yarn over and pull through all 6 loops to make pompom

sl st into next 6 stitches\*

sl st twice to end
